A small committee has been formed to ask the Fellowship how it/we should celebrate our 80th anniversary in 2025.

At the February meeting, The Board adopted the following statement of purpose: "In the spirit of unity and in keeping with our primary purpose of carrying the message to all who suffer from alcoholism, commemorate 80 years of AA in Australia. We will achieve this year long program, implementing new literature initiatives, celebrating our fellowship; and carrying the message."

Australia was the first country outside North America to start AA meetings. The first such meeting was on 1st March 1945 in Sydney. Today an AA presence can be found in approximately 180 countries.

In 2025, AA will be 90 years old – and 80 years old in

Australia.

We begin by asking the Fellowship how we should celebrate this milestone and seek the engagement of the Fellowship through groups, districts and areas as General per our Service Structure.

On the AA website you will find a new tab named AA80, this will be the place where all the information on projects and events will be listed and updated. Now is the time to start the conversation on how you'd like to celebrate 80 years of AA in Australia. We want to hear from you.

Remote Communities Coordinator goes for a drive

My name is Diane and I am an alcoholic and very grateful for sobriety today and to be of service. I have recently completed a trip ¾ the way around Australia; very fortunate not to be impacted by COVID at all and it was easy traveling between states.



The first leg of my journey was with the Qld tag-a-long beginning in Lightening Ridge and finishing in Normanton. I sent a follow up email to as many professionals who had attended the Professional Awareness



I then continued my journey through the Northern Territory attending the Douglas Daly, Darwin and Katherine Roundups. Weaving in and out of the next tag-a-long (which is not connected to the Qld one) enjoying the meetings and fellowship; sharing experience, strength and hope. Placing the books Alcoholics Anonymous and One to Another in Mataranka and Katherine libraries.



Travelling down the Western Australia coast and with a side trip to Newman, my admiration goes to those members who live in remote locations and have opened meetings or been the AA contact for up to and over 30 years. Members in remote locations really embrace visiting members and I found them very hospitable. The last of the One to Another books were given to remote meetings along with some pamphlets.



There are so many places to see and so very many things to do. I am not sure that I kept up with my role as the National Remote Communities Coordinator but I made some lifelong friends and gained more insight into life in the remote locations. For instance, access to the phone and/or internet is varied and often times non-existent, alcoholics are now drinking hand sanitiser as it can have 60% or more alcohol content. members do not attend meetings leaving the few who attend to do the service, and not everyone can read and write.



This year the Qld tag-a-long is from Lightning Ridge (they all start from the Ridge and each year a different route is taken), and finish in Mt Isa. The Remote Communities are funding information pamphlets and a couple of Professional Awareness Luncheons, one at Cunnamulla and the other in Mt Isa. The Far

Western District and Area B are providing the Alcoholics Anonymous books to be given to the participants. The committee used to donate the books to the local libraries, however we have since found out that if the books are not taken out on loan they are eventually removed. The journey has made me ponder on how AA's message can be carried into remote communities; this includes indigenous and non-indigenous alcoholics who are dying because they do not know where to find the help they may desire. What is currently being done? Who is doing the work? Do you have any suggestions on how the remote communities committee help?



These are the questions I would like the answers too, if you or someone you know are doing this type of service, please contact me so we can report to the fellowship on what and how we are carrying the message to remote communities and if what you are doing is successful can be implemented elsewhere.

My service history began putting chairs away at a local meeting and as I found a sponsor and began working the 12 steps I Started Book Studies and progressed through our Service structure as a GSR then PI/CPC Coordinator and Area Delegate at Area B in the Central Region.

I have been very lucky to have had great role models who have shown me how to take our 12 steps and make that my Primary Purpose and the sole aim of AA with the hope of reaching the 3rd person and the Suffering Alcoholic to let them know of the AA Solution.

I attended the National PI/ CPC and TCF(Treatment and Correctional Facilities) Forum in Brisbane in February, it was great to see so many of our members starting out on their service journey and experienced members there to add a lot of knowledge and wisdom.








Stepping Stones are currently recruiting for a volunteer project where people can volunteer from their home computers with internet connections to help transcribe and categorize Bill's handwritten letters.
