Just another reminder - the new Area B NER bank account details are: BSB: 034 033 Account number: 419903 The transition across from the old Commonwealth account to the new Westpac account continues to go well. I have been able to contact most groups listed to advise them of the new bank account details. We have allowed for the old account to be open until November 2024. If there are no deposits in the next coming months we may be able to close the account by the next Area Assembly in August. I will update Area then. Attached is a transaction report for the Area B bank accounts and in summary:

- Total group and member donations (including cheques) was \$2,867.84 (Previous quarter was \$2,061.29)
- Outgoings for the period were \$3,102.60 These included: \$1,500 to the GSO Fuel levies for committee members attending Paddington Assembly In November \$1,033 to cover costs for the Area B PI/PCP Coordinator to attend the National PI Forum in Adelaide in November, 2024. Our available funds after keeping a \$2000 prudent reserve are \$2,874.43 Also, I recently followed up a query regarding group Public Liability Insurance through the GSO. Groups are automatically covered by the GSO's Public Liability insurance whether they contribute to the 60/30/10 or not. Of course it is strongly encouraged to contribute, especially if groups have surplus funds. However groups do not lose their insurance should they fall short and not be able to contribute. This was confirmed in a follow up email to the GSO.

We are happy to report that our approved members are doing a great job in carrying the message inside Woodford, although visitor attendances can be a bit spasmodic, possibly due to the Xmas break, and public holidays in January, February and March. The Correctional staff do a great job preparing lists for those wishing to attend, but this can change quite quickly if there are incidents within the facility. We now attend Secure 2 on a weekly basis, instead of one week at Secure one and the following week at Secure 2. This change was implemented to provide a more consistent approach for our visitors and, hopefully, help stabilise attendance.

Our 12 step volunteer numbers are fairly stable, and we have started the approval process for another member wishing to join the team, and if successful, will bring our numbers to twelve.

A huge thank you to all members actively helping promote this area of 12 step work.

Pamphlets and little big books supply was running low and there was a purchase of Pocket big books and pamphlets on the 20/11/2023 which left a Budget balance of **\$29.75**.

#### **Zoom Coordinators Report**

#### Hi everyone Kim, alcoholic.

The latest purchase for the Zoom Coordinator's kit was a USB multi-port hub at the last Area Assembly in my absence. This was approved during the November Area Assembly. The current summary of the Zoom kit is as follows: 1 x Jabra speaker/microphone (from previous committee) \$145 1 x Zoom subscription (purchased last July, annual cost) \$231.1 x Rode omnidirectional microphone (purchased last April) \$263 1 x USB hub with 4 ports (purchased last November) \$ 34 Total spent so far: \$673 When I came into this role I was advised just bringing a laptop was sufficient, however the requirements of the role have progressed and it is probably worth discussion. The addition of screen sharing committee members reports while the Assembly is in underway has meant that now more equipment is required by way of a second laptop or webcam and monitor combo. This has also meant that more administration is required for the duration of the assembly than previously. By bringing a second laptop to the Area Assemblies I have been able to meet these new requirements, but I am wondering how easy it will be to pass on this role to the next Zoom Coordinator with autonomy, while also being aware of how much is being spent. The most recent suggestion is that the Area now purchase a monitor and webcam to add to the kit. Costs for these range from \$100 to \$150 for a webcam and \$200 to \$250 for a monitor. This would make handing over the kit very clear to the new person as they would know exactly what equipment they have to conduct the Zoom meeting, especially if communication or information about a venue is scarce. And then there is a guarantee of consistency in how Zoom for the Assemblies is being conducted. However, I have a few concerns.

- 1. This would mean spending another \$300 to \$400, creating quite a substantial and expensive professional Zoom kit for an AA entity that only gathers 4 times per year.
- 2. Anything we add has the possibility to outdate. Which I understand could take years, but after only 4 uses per year, that's a very expensive initial outlay.
- 3. If the Zoom Coordinator's kit or the role becomes too complicated, we exclude people from taking on the role.
- 4. By offering to screen share reports we are creating more tasks and requirements for more equipment when these reports are readily available by email to zoom attendees. The initial more pressing issues of setting up a Zoom account specifically for Area B (rather than reimbursing personal zoom accounts) and the poor sound quality for those zooming in, have been resolved. I am wondering if we are over capitalising on this one portfolio and if this is a good use of AA funds? On a separate note I have created an Area B Zoom Coordinator's document that has instructions, basic check list and log in information. While this is all available in the google drive for the Coordinator and the minutes, this is a laminated hard copy that will stay with the physical kit.



Since the start of the new district, me stepping into the my new role in December and now with more groups electing members as their group PI coordinators, the work which has been carried out has been exceptional. In Redcliffe and the surrounding Peninsula, the momentum remains solid with a number of members preserve to maintain momentum in carrying the message. Persistent top ups and regular check ups are ongoing and continues to be welcomed by the community. At Bribie Island, a number of eager members carried the message on January 17th. In March, Marty - Caboolture PI coordinator and myself will arrange a suitable date & time for a discussion, together with a plan of attack on when and how we may be at service in carrying the message to the sick and suffering in the Caboolture and surrounding areas. The meeting will also involve in highlighting the simplicity of the spreadsheet, together with the email set up and Dropbox access. We have now also received information about various H&I opportunities to be held in schools. The feedback received highlighted the need to carry the message and try to help, or plant the seed in the early stages off adult lives.... I'm completely aware that this may perhaps involve other groups such as Alateen, or members who are keen to do service and hold a current Blue Card. I understand that AA is not affiliated with other groups, but the reason for me to mention this in my report is to highlight the importance of Public Information and the ripple effect it has caused by doing service. Overall, I would like to thank all the groups for their efforts in demonstrating unity as well as their continuous willingness to work together and to practice these principles in our affairs.
